Matthew 2:1-12, CEB

1 After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in the territory of Judea during the rule of King Herod, magi came from the east to Jerusalem. 2 They asked, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We've seen his star in the east, and we've come to honor him." 3 When King Herod heard this, he was troubled, and everyone in Jerusalem was troubled with him. 4 He gathered all the chief priests and the legal experts and asked them where the Christ was to be born. 5 They said, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for this is what the prophet wrote:

6 You, Bethlehem, land of Judah,
by no means are you least among the rulers of Judah,
because from you will come one who governs,
who will shepherd my people Israel."

7 Then Herod secretly called for the magi and found out from them the time when the star had first appeared. 8 He sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search carefully for the child. When you've found him, report to me so that I too may go and honor him." 9 When they heard the king, they went; and look, the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stood over the place where the child was. 10 When they saw the star, they were filled with joy. 11 They entered the house and saw the child with Mary his mother. Falling to their knees, they honored him. Then they opened their treasure chests and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. 12 Because they were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they went back to their own country by another route.

Through his Holy Spirit, Jesus draws near to those who draw near to him and he promises that those who seek will find him.

Seek Christ

Star wise men came from the east to Jerusalem to worship the one who has been born the king of the Jews. They have come to worship. They begin asking around about where the king is located.

Herod, who is the king of the region, starts to get afraid. I am the king. I don't know who these guys are looking for, but it can't be good for me. So he tells the wise men, when you find him, come back and let me know because I, also, want to come and worship.

Then they left the king and followed the star which they had seen until it rested over the place where the child was.

Difficult and Hard

They saw the star and they followed it. We read this one little verse and we don't really grasp the magnitude of what the wise men did.

It is likely that they traveled from what would have been known as Persia, which is modern day Iran, all the way to where Jesus was. This is a distance of about 900 miles.

They did not get their on the Turnpike or anything like it. This was a long and difficult journey which they made to worship the one who they thought might be the savior.

Self Reflection

What is difficult and hard for you?

What experience of your life? What challenge are you facing right now?

Is it hard for you to seek Christ?

Overjoyed - joy on joy

Verse 10 says, when they saw the star they were filled with joy. I want to pause a moment on this sentence to take a closer look at what they were experiencing. The english translation doesn't do a great job. There are actually four greek words that are translated into "they were filled with joy"

Another version of the Bible says this "they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy." The greek words literally mean, they rejoiced with a huge, incredible, overwhelming joy.

It is kind of like compounding joy – we are happy that we are happy that he is there. It is almost impossible to describe how full of life they were.

They have been waiting for centuries for someone that would be born who would save them from their sins. From the depths of their soul they are filled with an overwhelming sense of joy.

Underjoyed

Here is the problem with some followers of Christ today - they are under-joyed. We should be the most overjoyed people around and too many times we are under-joyed.

This is something that I have to remind myself about. If you are happy, if you are filled with joy – let your face know. Crack a smile once in a while.

Self Reflection

What brings you great joy?

Does your faith or following after God bring you great joy?

Worship

When they arrive, they worship by presenting to Jesus gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. They were overjoyed to bow down and worship to give gifts to the one who would save them.

Example of Joy of Giving

Significance of gifts

It has been debated for centuries what these gifts actually meant or symbolized. The general thinking is that the gold represented Christ's kingship. The king of kings and lord of lords has been born.

Frankincense symbolized the divinity of the Christ

Myrrh was used in embalming – to prepare people for burial. Many believe that this was a foreshadowing that Jesus was actually born to die.

They worshiped him and they were overjoyed to bring their gifts as an act of worship. They opened up the best of what they had and offered it to Jesus.

Good News

The good news is that we worship God because God first loved us. We offer ourselves and our gifts to be used by God because God sought us out before we could understand it for ourselves. The magi were coming to worship a Christ who was already here. God came to earth to show God's love for us.
